1. Banded Agate		<p>Description: Layered chalcedony with alternating bands in tones of white, grey, brown, or translucent hues. Found in volcanic and sedimentary rocks. Mohs hardness ~6.5–7.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Promotes stability, grounding, emotional healing, and mental clarity. Often used to restore balance and bring inner strength.</p>
2. Eye Agate		<p>Description: Distinctive agate featuring concentric circular bands that resemble eyes. Naturally occurring in a variety of colors.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Believed to offer psychic protection, enhance awareness, and ward off negative energy. Encourages mindfulness and vision.</p>
3. Dendrite Agate		<p>Description: A translucent variety of agate containing fern- or tree-like inclusions of iron or manganese. Typically white, grey, or light tan.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Encourages personal growth, connection to nature, and inner peace. Known as the “Stone of Plenitude” for abundance and clarity.</p>
4. Moss Agate		<p>Description: A form of chalcedony with green moss-like inclusions set in a clear or milky background. Found in the U.S., India, and Brazil.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Symbolizes new beginnings and growth. Stimulates emotional balance, healing, and abundance—especially connected to nature.</p>
5. Aventurine		<p>Description: Typically green quartz with sparkling mica or fuchsite inclusions that give it a shimmering, glittery appearance. Mohs hardness ~7. Commonly found in India, Brazil, and Russia.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Promotes prosperity, optimism, and emotional calm. Often linked to the heart chakra and used to attract opportunities and boost creativity.</p>
6. Sodalite		<p>Description: Rich, royal blue stone with orange and white calcite veins or flecks. Has a soft, matte finish in polished form. Mohs hardness ~5.5–6. Found mainly in Canada and Brazil.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Enhances logic, communication, and self-expression. Supports truthfulness and insight, and balances throat chakra energies.</p>
7. Fluorite		<p>Description: Colorful crystalline mineral—commonly purple, green, blue, or multicolored with banding. Crystal form is cubic, Mohs hardness ~4.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Encourages mental clarity, focus, and decision-making. Protective against electromagnetic pollution and aids spiritual growth.</p>

8. Chevron Amethyst		<p>Description: Purple variety of quartz, appearing in clusters, points, or tumbled stones, ranging from light lavender to deep violet. Mohs hardness ~7. Major sources include Brazil, Uruguay, and Zambia.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Known as a calming, protective stone that supports meditation, sleep, intuition, and spiritual awareness. Supports crown and third-eye chakra alignment.</p>
9. Serpentine		<p>Description: A mottled green mineral with either smooth or fibrous texture, resembling jade. Mohs hardness ~3.5–5.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Known for clearing and activating chakras, easing emotional trauma, promoting transformation, compassion, and deep healing. Often used to help with inner peace and spiritual growth.</p>
10. Green Calcite		<p>Description: A soft green, translucent calcite variety, often in rough chunks or polished pieces. Mohs hardness ~3; commonly sourced from Mexico, Brazil, and Romania.</p> <p>Metaphysical: A heart healer—calms stress, balances emotions, supports renewal and prosperity. Enhances heart chakra connection, emotional growth, and clearing stagnant energy.</p>
11. Jasper		<p>Description: Earth-toned opaque chalcedony with patterns or speckles. Mohs ~6.5–7; sources include Africa, Australia, India, USA.</p> <p>Metaphysical: A nurturing, grounding stone offering protection, stability, endurance, and emotional support. Connects with root and sacral chakras.</p>
12. Black Tourmaline		<p>Description: Deep black, shiny, prismatic silicate mineral. Mohs hardness ~7–7.5; mined in Africa, Brazil, USA.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Powerful protective stone that absorbs negative energies, electromagnetic fields, and psychic interference. Grounds energy and promotes serenity and purification.</p>
13. Charoite		<p>Description: A vivid purple fibrous mineral often polished as cabochons or tumbled stones. Mohs hardness ~5–6; primarily found in Siberia, Russia.</p> <p>Metaphysical: A transformational crystal—helps release fear, supports emotional healing, enhances intuition, and deep spiritual insight. Aligns with higher chakras and encourages personal growth.</p>
14. Carnelian		<p>Description: Orange-red chalcedony with a translucent to opaque lustre. Mohs hardness ~6.5–7; commonly sourced from Brazil, India, Egypt.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Energizing and inspiring; boosts confidence, motivation, creativity, and vitality. Supports sacral chakra and enhances courage and passion.</p>

15. Red Agate		<p>Description: Reddish chalcedony often banded or solid in color. Mohs hardness ~6.5–7; found in volcanic deposits worldwide.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Grounding and stabilizing; enhances energy, stamina, and sense of security. Associated with root chakra and emotional resilience.</p>
16. Pink Quartz (Rose Quartz)		<p>Description: Pale pink to blush quartz, translucent to opaque, often polished or tumbled. Mohs hardness ~7; widely found in Brazil, Madagascar, South Africa.</p> <p>Metaphysical: The stone of love and compassion; promotes unconditional love, forgiveness, emotional healing, and heart chakra balance.</p>
17. Zebra Jasper		<p>Description: Striking black-and-white or occasionally dark brown chalcedony with a bold zebra-stripe pattern. Mohs hardness ~6.5–7. Commonly found in various volcanic deposits worldwide.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Offers grounding support and emotional balance. Often called the “stone of being,” it harmonizes yin-yang energies, boosts motivation, and helps see through illusion while aligning with root-and-crown chakras</p>
18. Goldstone		<p>Description: A man-made glittering glass (also called aventurine glass). Most often reddish-brown with copper sparkles, also found in blue or green forms.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Encourages ambition, courage, and vitality. The reflective sparkle is said to enhance confidence, creativity, and uplift the spirit while grounding one in ambition and drive</p>
19. Hematite		<p>Description: A metallic grey to black iron-oxide mineral that polishes to a reflective sheen. Mohs hardness ~5–6. Found globally in sedimentary and metamorphic formations.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Known for powerful grounding and protection. Helps stabilize energies, boost strength, endurance, and calm the mind—often used for balancing and centering</p>
20. Calcite		<p>Description: A translucent to opaque carbonate mineral (CaCO₃) available in various colors—including white, yellow, orange, and green. Mohs hardness ~3. Widely abundant in sedimentary rock layers.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Amplifies energy and cleanses environments. Green or orange calcite are especially associated with heart and solar plexus chakra healing, emotional renewal, and creative inspiration</p>
21. Rhodonite		<p>Description: Rose-pink to red manganese-rich mineral, often mottled with black manganese oxide veins. Mohs hardness ~5.5–6. Found in Russia, Australia, and the U.S.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Renowned for emotional healing, forgiveness, and clearing emotional wounds. Supports heart chakra balance, encourages compassion and self-love.</p>

22. Snowflake Obsidian		<p>Description: Black volcanic glass with distinctive white or gray “snowflake” inclusions of cristobalite. Mohs hardness ~5–6. Common worldwide.</p> <p>Metaphysical: A purity stone that helps release negative mental patterns and stress. Brings balance, insight, and clarity. Useful for grounding and self-reflection.</p>
23. Labradorite		<p>Description: Iridescent feldspar with flashes of blue, green, gold, or orange (labradorescence). Mohs hardness ~6–6.5. Mined mainly in Canada, Madagascar.</p> <p>Metaphysical: “Stone of transformation”—enhances intuition, psychic abilities, and spiritual insight. Protects aura and strengthens inner clarity.</p>
24. Mahogany Obsidian		<p>Description: Rich reddish-brown and black volcanic glass. Mohs hardness ~5–6. Sourced from obsidian-bearing volcanic regions like Mexico.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Grounding and protective. Helps dissolve emotional blocks, boosts self-worth and inner strength. Enhances vitality and supports endurance.</p>
25. Unakite		<p>Description: A mottled metamorphic rock composed of pink orthoclase feldspar, green epidote, and quartz. Opaque with a vitreous to greasy luster; Mohs hardness around 6–7.</p> <p>Metaphysical: A stone of balance and vision—harmonizes heart and third-eye chakras, supports emotional healing, spiritual growth, and gentle transformation. Helps release old patterns while promoting resilience and emotional clarity.</p>
26. Coral Fossil (Fossil Coral)		<p>Description: Fossilized coral replaced by silica (agate), showing characteristic flower- or star-like patterns in cream, tan, or brown hues; Mohs hardness ~6–7.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Grounding and protective energy that connects one to ancient wisdom. Soothes turbulent emotions, increases patience, and supports physical endurance. Believed to promote healing of bone structure and circulation while enhancing inner calm and clarity</p>
27. Carnelian & Chalcedony Combo		<p>Description: A banded combination of carnelian (orange to red chalcedony) and lighter chalcedony (white or blue-grey); translucent to opaque, Mohs hardness 6.5–7</p> <p>Metaphysical: Merges the vitality and courage of carnelian with the calm clarity of chalcedony. Encourages creativity, decisiveness, emotional balance, and grounded motivation. Ideal for boosting drive while maintaining emotional composure</p>

28. Amazonite		<p>Description: A blue-green microcline feldspar variety with a glassy luster, often streaked with white matrix; Mohs hardness around 6–6.5. Found in Russia, Brazil, Madagascar, and parts of the U.S.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Known as the “Stone of Courage and Truth,” amazonite soothes the nervous system, promotes emotional balance, and enhances communication. Associated with the heart and throat chakras. Supports self-trust, healthy boundaries, and manifestation of intentions. Also linked to prosperity, luck, and harmony</p>
29. Black Onyx		<p>Description: A deep black variety of chalcedony (agate family), often polished to a glossy sheen. Mohs hardness ~6.5–7. Includes parallel banding in natural specimens.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Protective and grounding. Helps with self-control, strength in tough situations, emotional stability, and bonds negative energy. Great for focus and personal resilience.</p>
30. Bloodstone (Heliotrope)		<p>Description: Dark green chalcedony (jasper/chalcedony mix) with red hematite spots. Mohs hardness ~6.5–7. Also known as heliotrope.</p> <p>Metaphysical: The “Spiritual Warrior” stone—embodies courage, purification, and noble action. Grounds spiritual energy, enhances integrity, intuition, and resilience.</p>
31. Tiger Eye		<p>Description: Golden to reddish-brown chatoyant quartz with a silky, reflective bandlike effect. Mohs hardness ~6.5–7. Mined in South Africa, Australia, India, etc.</p> <p>Metaphysical: Strengthens confidence, clarity, and courage. Balances lower chakras, protects against negativity, grounds energy, and inspires creativity and determination.</p>
32. Lemon Chrysoprase		<p>Description: Citrine-yellow to apple-green chalcedony (nickel-bearing), polished into cabochons; Mohs hardness ~6–7.</p> <p>Metaphysical: A joyful heart-healer; encourages emotional balance, self-love, confidence, compassion, and spiritual insight. Supports heart, throat, and crown chakras; helpful for releasing past trauma and enhancing mental clarity.</p>
